

PORT OF ANACORTES

Resolution No. 1236

June 2, 2011

A Resolution of the Commission of the Port of Anacortes establishing policy guidelines for parking on Port property.

WHEREAS, the Commission of the Port of Anacortes has concluded that a policy needs to be established providing guidelines for parking on Port property; and

WHEREAS, the Commission discussed parking needs for current and future tenants, public access, Transit Shed, and other community events, among others; and,

WHEREAS, the Port parking policy must be consistent with the Port's Mission Statement, Strategic Plan and Comprehensive Plan for current and potential development; and

WHEREAS, the Port parking policy must be consistent with all Federal, State and local laws and codes pertaining to parking; and

WHEREAS, the Port's adopted 2008 Comprehensive Plan includes current and future parking requirements for the following uses:

Port employees, contractors and customers along with their contractors and guests
Port tenants and their employees, customers, contractors and guests, and public access

And,

WHEREAS, the Commission wishes to establish priority uses for temporary parking on Port property until the property is required for a permanent use in the Comprehensive Plan;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the priority for temporary parking uses be set as follows:

1. Transit Shed events, Kayakers, and Small Boat Launch and Storage Users
2. Festival Attendees for Port sponsored events
3. Festival Attendees for other than Port events
4. Parking Leased to others, on a space available basis, lease term on a month-to-month basis subject to Commission approval after review of impacts and benefits of the proposed use.
5. Recreational Vehicles
6. All other parking

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission directs the Executive Director to develop a Port of Anacortes Parking Plan for Commission approval that resolves conflicts and assures that higher priority users are served ahead of any lower priority.

PASSED AND ADOPTED by the Port Commission of the Port of Anacortes in open session on the 2nd day of June, 2011 and duly authenticated by the signatures of the Commissioners voting in favor thereof.
