Environmental canopy

Project Manager Jenkins Dossen monitors erection of a portable canopy on Port of Anacortes Pier 2. The 120 ft. X 260 ft. covered area will be used for the separation and processing of dredged sediments transported to the Pier 2 Material Handling Facility from the former Scott Paper mill project site adjacent to the Cap Sante Boat Haven. Rocks and debris are screened from the sediments. The rocks will be used as refill, while the debris and sediments will be transported to a waste disposal site in eastern Washington. The 46 foot high canopy sits atop 2-foot ecoblocks and features mechanical and electrical systems.
